Social Service at Koralahosahalli Tribal Village

Date: 21st August 2025

Organised by: New Horizon Educational Institution

Total Volunteers: 25 (18 NCC cadets + 7 NSS volunteers)

Venue: Koralahosahalli [Bandipur]

Tribe: Soligas

In a significant step towards community development and social upliftment, New Horizon Educational Institution has adopted 93 tribal villages in the Bandipur, Nagarwala, and Kabini forest areas. As a part of this initiative, NCC and NSS Students of the college volunteered for a day of Community Service to assist with the following programs.

- 1) To hand over newly built houses to the villagers.
- 2) To lay the foundation stone for the construction of a temple in the village, which is expected to serve as a spiritual centre.
- 3) To distribute commodities such as food, clothing, and daily necessities.

Every individual, whether an adult or a child, deserves to live with essentials and facilities, and this is what is achieved through this camp. The community service camp was conducted for a day on 21/08/2025. It was a 4-hour drive from our college campus to the village.

Our first stop was at Hotel Shri Renukamba, where we had breakfast before resuming the trip.

As part of this initiative, NHEI management handed over newly built houses to the villagers, providing them with safe, permanent shelter. This marked a major milestone in improving living standards for the local tribal families, many of whom previously lived in vulnerable conditions.

4) Temple Foundation stone is laid

By around noon, we arrived at our destination, where we were warmly welcomed by the village volunteer team. The program commenced with a foundation stone laying ceremony. This was followed by an insightful speech delivered by a community representative, highlighting the cultural and social values of the village.

Essential commodities were distributed to all the houses of the village and following the donation drive, our team engaged in a cleanliness activity, where we collected and disposed of plastic waste in and

around the area, contributing towards a cleaner and healthier environment. This marked the conclusion of our service activities in the village.



6) Motivational Speech by Surya Narayan Sir [Member of Vishwa Hindu Parishath]



A speech was given on several problems faced by community people, and Sir encouraged students to do service for the community.

7) Lunch/Dinner: 06:00 pm/10:00pm

After the event, lunch was provided to all at Sri Krishna Café, where everyone halted and got refreshed before continuing our return journey. At night, students had dinner at Udupi Ruchi Grand

Hotel, after which we proceeded with the final stretch back to Bengaluru. By late night, we safely reached our NHCE campus, marking the conclusion of a memorable and enriching journey.
