Minutes of the Meeting

Review and Recording of minutes of previous meeting.

Principal read out the minutes of the 15th G C meeting.

All the agenda points were discussed and committee members have unanimously ratified and approved the 15th GC Meeting.

Agenda 2

Calendar of events of the academic year 2021-22.

Calendar of events of the institution & all department were presented by principal. All the calendar of events was discussed in details and approved by the committee.

Agenda 3

Review and Ratification of Appointments of Teaching and Non- Teaching Staff.

Principal has presented the status of appointments of teaching and Non-Teaching staff for the Year 2021-22. He informed that the total of 51 teaching staff at different levels depending on the requirement of the departments were appointed. Principal informed that in the panel of selection board one VTU member was also included as all the interview were conducted online.

All the appointments were ratified and approved by the GC members.

Review of R&D activities.

Principal presented the R&D activities.

Patents: total of 317 patents have been filed as of date and 83 patents have been filed for the year 2021. He also informed that the income from patents is Rs 18375000/- as on 21/01/2021.

Grants: Principal informed that a total no of 52 sponsored research projects were taken worth about Rs 78599314/- and 112 no's consultancy project worth about Rs 11880000/-.

All the committee members have appreciated the performance of R&D and expressed there is still lot of scope to improve the R&D activities.

NBA Tier-I certification

Principal was very happy to announce that NHCE is accredited for NBA Tier-I Washington Accord for the following branches of Engineering with scores as given below

He informed that an expert team conducted online evaluation of the programs from 16/04/2021- 18/04/2021.

The accreditation status granted for the above department and is valid for a period of 3 years.

All the committee members have congratulated the principal and all the staff members for the grand success.

Review of placement status.

Principal has presented the placement status of students in National & International companies for the year 2020-21 & 2021-2022.

A total of 7 students are placed for the year 2021 & for the year 2022 as of date 7 students are already placed in international companies. Further he informed that a total of 804 students are placed for the year 2021& a total of 907 students are already placed for the year 2022 in national companies. He also informed that the placements for 2022 will further increase.

All the committee have appreciated the efforts put in by the HRD in improving the placements of students for the year 2021-22.

Agenda 7

Review on preparation for NAAC 2nd cycle of certification.

Principal informed the committee that the preparation for NAAC 2nd cycle accreditation is under way and the details are as under

- The process of NAAC Accreditation for second cycle started through the preparation of Institutional Information for Quality Assessment (IIQA).
- The IIQA of the institute was submitted on 07th January, 2021 through payment of fees of Rs. 29,500/-
- The IIQA of the institute was successfully accepted by NAAC.
- The Preparation towards the Self Study Report (SSR) as per the NAAC manual began immediately as the SSR had to be submitted though the NAAC portal within 45 days of acceptance of IIQA.
- The SSR comprised of both Qualitative and Quantitative metrics.
- The Quantitative Metrics (QnM) added up to about 70% and the remaining about 30% were Qualitative Metrics (QlM).

- The Self Study Report for second cycle of accreditation for NAAC was successfully submitted on 17th April, 2021 with a payment of 50% accreditation fees of Rs.4,42,500/-
- The Clarifications for Data Validation and Verification (DVV) process
 were received from NAAC as the part of the accreditation process.
- The clarifications from the Institute for DVV clarifications were successfully submitted on 14th June, 2021.
- The status of prequalification is awaited from NAAC after the DVV process.

All the committee members express their happiness on the preparation made.

Agenda 8

Review on preparation of AQAR.

Principal briefed the committee about the preparation for AQAR and the details are as under

- As per the NAAC guidelines, all the institutes need to submit AQAR online for each year though the HEI portal.
- The data has to be filled in the prescribed format as suggested by NAAC for the academic year completed i.e. 2020-21
- The data templates have to be submitted online along with the AQAR with appropriate metrics.
- All the Qualitative metrics needs to be filled within 200 words.
- The NAAC AQAR 2020-21 of the institute has to be submitted within 31st December, 2021 as per the notification received by NAAC
- Instructions were given to all the departments to start the preparation towards NAAC AQAR 2020-21

Review & discussion on various statutory committees' proceedings

Principal informed that there are about 40 statutory committees as per the guidelines of AICTE/VTU. These committees meet once in 6 months or whenever there is a need and discuss the relevant point and MOM is uploaded in the college website. He informed that there is an amendment in the committee members of IQAC. Dr. Rajalakshmi HOD- CSE is the member secretary. All the committee members have given their consent and approved the same.

Discussion on feedback from stake holders

Principal has explained the process of taking the feedback from various stake holders such as Students, Parents, Alumni students, Employers & Industries for improving the system/subjects handled at various levels.

Agenda 12

Review on continuation of autonomous status UGC application

Principal informed that NHCE has obtained Autonomous status from UGC for a period of 6 years starting from 2015-16 to 21-22.

Further for continuation of Autonomous status the following preparation are under way:

- Since the process of extension had to be started prior, there was a discussion on submission of Proforma for the extension of autonomous status to University Grants Commission (UGC) through Visvesvaraya Technological University (VTU), Belagavi which is our affiliated university.
- 2. It was decided that the Institute had to submit the Proforma for Extension of Autonomous status to UGC through VTU as early as possible.

- For the same, necessary data along with Annexures was to be made ready as per the prescribed format.
- 4. The format included Institutional details, Accreditation details, Students details, Examination reforms, Teaching –Learning methodologies adopted by the college, Progress report of the college, Utilization certificate etc.

Approval of Annual Report

Principal informed that the VTU annual report for the year 2020-21 as per the VTU format has been prepared and sent to VTU for approval. The VTU annual report sent to VTU was reviewed by all the committee members and approved.

Review on Entrepreneurship Development Cell (EDC) & startup activities

Principal informed that EDC inculcates entrepreneurship among the students and faculties of NHCE. Faculty and student coordinators of all the departments of NHCE are the members of ED cell. National Innovation and Start-up Policy (NISP) is framed at college level to facilitate Innovation and entrepreneurship among students and faculties under the guidance of MOE. NHCIIE has incubated 6companies in last one year.

Principal Dr. Manjunatha Member Secretary cordially welcomed all the members of the Governing Council. Member Secretary presented the Agenda of the 15^{th} Governing council.

Agenda 1

Review and Recording of minutes of previous meeting.

Principal read out the minutes of the 14th G C meeting.

All the committee members have unanimously ratified and approved 14th GC meeting.

Agenda 2

Calendar of events of the academic year 2020-21.

Calendar of events for Even semester 2020-21(II, IV,VI and VIII Semester) were discussed in detail and principal asked how to go about conducting supplementary semester. It was suggested by Dr. Ravi Shankar that the supplementary semester should be conducted in parallel and the period of the semester should be reduced by 50% so as to complete the semester comfortably. He also suggested that instead of going for complete duration the teaching hours shall be reduced to 24 hours for 4 credit course. Further he suggested that instead of fixing the maximum credits, it is better to fix maximum number of courses to 4 for supplementary semester registration. This suggestion was welcomed by all the members of GC.

Principal informed that the NIRF ranking of the institution is having a downward trend, for which Dr. Ravi Shankar informed many Universities are put under engineering colleges and they mobilize heavy funds for the R&D Activities. He also suggested by increasing the publication standards the ranking can be improved. Indexed publication needs to be encouraged and most of the publications have to be through web of science, SCI. Publications for the ongoing Academic year 2020-21 need to be improved. Number of patents filed, grants received for the year 2020-21 is enclosed at Annexure -

Review on preparation for NBA Tier-I certification.

Principal informed that NBA Tier – I Certification Audit is scheduled from 16^{th} - 18^{th} April 2021. Principal invited Dr. Ravi Shankar to be present in our campus on 16^{th} April 2021 for which he has readily accepted.

Principal informed that the institution is going for NBA Audit for 4 departments Viz ME, CSE, ECE and CE. Audit of one department to be done by other department coordinators and the best practices need to be followed by other departments.

Dr. Ravi Shankar suggested inviting Dr. Kanmani of BMSCE for mock Audit of NBA.

Executive Director HRD presented the placement details for the Academic year. He informed that about 70% Students are placed out of the eligible candidates. He informed that major challenges for this year due to the pandemic were online placements and the training was conducted online. He informed that the major achievements were, highest package of 19.34 lakhs per annum for 21 students and the average salary has increased from 3.5 lakhs to 5.0 lakhs per annum. The highest placements of 126 students is by capgemini.

Dr. TG Sitaram has appreciated the efforts put in by the placement department.

ED also informed that this year all the trainings were conducted in house by placement staff.

- 6. The syllabus rightly balances technical data and the language learning process. Priority has been given to hands on training which will provide the skills that a student can implement their Knowledge in Industrial purpose and also in academic purpose. Special interest has been given to improve the life skills and also helps in their technical development and the students can build their own career independently. I am happy with the prescribed syllabus.
- Guide students with real VLSI related tools like synopsis and make them practice with different problems.
- 8. Include System Verilog and scripting in syllabus.
- 9. Make students to focus on technical knowledge than aptitude.
- 10. Please make students to spend more time in labs, especially VLSI labs.

Summary of feedback from the Employers:

- The Syllabus is well constructed for all semesters but few more important concepts need to be added. Below are the concepts 1) Front end (HTML, CSS, JavaScript) 2) Any one Backend or server (PHP, SQL Server, Python). 3) Circuit design/PCB design. 4) In Embedded systems many boards like Raspberry Pi, Arduino-UNO, NANO etc. should be included. And also practical knowledge on sensors & actuators expected. 5) Robotics.
- 2. Very good list of electives, students should be guided how these will help in different domain/fields of industry. It is good to have project in early stage of course which will boost interest and students will be involved in research. But lack of theoretical knowledge or idea about different concept and application will be difficult for students, better to work in 3rd year. Train/educate/inspire students not only for grade/exam also for research, creative, industrial exposure.
- 3. According to my observation syllabus and subjects selected in elective some are new & industrial oriented. Credits allocation gives weightage for all aspects with respect to personal goal, industrial requirements, theoretical, application based, co-curricular. If it supported from NAAC or universities or college, 3-5 semester give students basics of different industrial domain in electronics and divide them according to their interest from 6th semester and give them relevant professional electives and labs, for e.g., Networking, VLSI, embedded coding. And help them to work on some projects. But need support from college to setup some new labs and industry tool/licenses.
- 4. Open electives in syllabus is good option but are focused mostly only routers, i.e., networking side in ECE, could have given some more option in the VLSI or embedded or communication stream. Assignments should make students refer GATE or IEEE or any other technical sites. Collect some list of objective question framed by students with answers on a Particular topic from syllabus. Here also student will do some research.
