

A Report on 79th Independence Day Celebration

The 79th Independence Day of India was celebrated at New Horizon College of Engineering with great enthusiasm and patriotic fervor. This year's theme was: "25 Years of Excellence, 79 Years of Freedom: Building the Future Together."

In his address, Col. Vijayasarathy highlighted India's remarkable journey since independence. He recalled the sacrifices of freedom fighters and proudly spoke about India's achievements.

- Advances in science and technology, with milestones like Chandrayaan and Mangalyaan.
- The bravery of the defense forces in Kargil and global peacekeeping missions.
- Growth in the economy, education, and healthcare, especially during the pandemic.
- Achievements in sports, cultural heritage, and the global recognition of yoga.

He emphasized that true patriotism lies not only in remembering the past but also in shaping the future. His speech concluded with a call to the youth to take responsibility and work collectively to make India a developed nation by 2047.

The Principal, Dr. Manjunatha, also addressed the gathering. He spoke about the transformative role of technology, artificial intelligence, and quantum computing in redefining the future. Linking his vision with the national mission of "Viksit Bharat 2047," he emphasized that India should no longer be viewed as a developing country but as a developed nation, given its rapid strides in science, technology, and socio-economic growth.
